Over the course of the last few weeks, I have had the opportunity to meet with all our Year 7 students and ask them

Meeting, following a presentation from Mr Fraser (Associate Assistant Head) and Mrs Stamford (Deputy Head), the governors approved the purchase of an exciting new teacher tool called a graphics tablet for each of our teachers, as part of our catch-up programme of work.

Following a trial by Mr Fraser with his students, we anticipate these devices will enhance both the teaching and learning experience for our students who are learning remotely, but also have value post-COVID-19 in the classroom.

#### **COVID-19 frequently asked questions**

What happens if the classrooms get too cold because the windows are open for increased ventilation?

Staff remain vigilant in monitoring the temperature of their classrooms. Last week we had a noticeable change in outside air temperature and the heating was not switched on.

As of 28 September, we have had written confirmation from the Local Authority, on behalf of 14-40, that the heating (without the air blowers being on) will be left on 24 hours a day, 7 days per week.

How do the "bubbles" work in terms of a COVID-19 positive case?

Years 7, 9, and 11 have lessons and breaks at the same time. Years 8 and 10 have lessons and breaks at the same time. If a child tests positive, it is only that year group that would potentially need to isolate for 14 days because:

The students are in the canteens at different times in Years 7 and 8 and, when in the canteen, are not sat facing one another.

The students sit in designated areas of the canteen and are not facing one another in the canteens in Years 9 and 11. Year 10 have the canteen to themselves at break and lunchtimes.

What is the procedure when the school is notified of a positive COVID-19 case?

The headteacher follows the East Riding of Yorkshire School Coronovirus (COVID-19) Response Protocol.

How do the "bubbles" work in terms of students moving groups?

As noted above, the year group is the "bubble" and students socialise outside of their tutor groups at break and lunchtime. As such, if needed, students can move tutor groups.

Who is responsible for cleaning student toilets and canteen areas in between student use?

As one of six PFI schools in Bridlington, Headlands School does not employ the premises, catering or cleaning teams. Instead they are employed by a company called 14-40.

The Local Authority are then responsible for overseeing and managing the specification of the contract, not Headlands School.

At Headlands School, since September 2020, 14-40 has employed an additional three members of staff who routinely clean all social areas, toilets, touch points and changing rooms during the school day.
