

**Overview:**

In your final year of Key Stage 4 music you will be bringing together all the elements of music performance, composition and appraising music into a set task for your final pieces of coursework/exam. This includes both performing and composing some of your own pieces in both familiar and less familiar styles!

Term 3:

You will be set your final assessment task from an external brief and a resulting exam. This will include all of the different skills you have studied over the last three years including composition, performance, music production and written evaluation.

This will be a task with a set amount of time allowed for completion and can be tailored to your own personal skills. It will require hard work resilience and the ability to work to set time constraints.

Term 1:

The first term will be focussed upon completing your performance portfolio of work including video diaries, recordings of performances, completing and annotation of compositions and including log books and evaluative materials from the course over the last year.

This half term will see the introduction of mock runs of the final task to allow you enough time to prepare and gain the necessary skills to perform to a high standard.

Term 2:

You continue to delve into the composition, looking at the application of the musical elements to both familiar and unfamiliar styles.

You will also begin your final preparations for the final task, ensuring you have effective revision tools for the practical and compositional tasks ahead.

You will also, if you wish, work towards completion of your final performances and compositions in music at the variety of showcases and concerts on offer.
