

Names for exam certificates

In January we will begin registering students for their external Summer exams. There have been cases where students have received exam certificates in a name that does not appear on their birth certificate.

This can cause problems when trying to gain entry to the Armed Forces and other careers which need to confirm identity from a birth certificate.

If we do not hear from you we will assume that our data is correct and that you accept full responsibility should any problems arise from incorrect information in the future.

Please check the letter which was sent out on 10th December 2020 and that the legal name we currently hold is correct. Exam boards will make a charge to change the legal names on certificates once produced.

Laptops

Headlands School has now spent over £30,000 of unfunded money on providing our students with much-needed laptops and Chromebooks for use for online home learning. Unfortunately, this still isn't enough and we are turning to our community for support.

In this third lockdown, we have identified around 40 students who still do not have access to an appropriate learning device.

COVID-19 has to date cost the school over £140.000 in unplanned expenditure and we have received only £865 back from the Department for Education.

It will cost the school £8,000 to purchase these much-needed devices. Any help you can provide in supporting our students during these extraordinary times would be greatly appreciáted.

LEFT: Mr Woodcock said Orla (Year 8) had 'smashed her Dystopian Protagonist intro out of the park' in English.


BOTTOM LEFT: Daniella (Year 8) was our first Artist of the Week in 2021.
