Subject: (AQA) GCSE Geography

Introduction

Students will travel the world from their classroom, exploring case studies in the United Kingdom (UK), higher income countries (HICs), newly emerging economies (NEEs) and lower income countries (LICs).

Topics of study include climate change, earthquakes, volcanoes, global shifts in economic power and the challenge of sustainable resource use. Students are also encouraged to understand their role in society, by considering different viewpoints, values and attitudes.

This is a forward looking course designed to equip young people with a thorough understanding of their world.
