e are back! It has certainly been a great week here at Headlands School - and so wonderful to hear and see the school full of students and staff again!

Writing on behalf of the Headlands School team, can I take this opportunity to thank parents and carers for ensuring your children have all arrived back prepared for learning with the correct equipment and appropriate uniform - it has certainly helped ease students back into 'in-school' learning.

Our re-integration plan has allowed for our programme of Lateral Flow Testing of consenting students.

A polite reminder here - without a complete Department for Education's Consent Form students cannot be tested by our team. This Consent Form was emailed to parents and carers on 6th January, 2021, and is also available on the Parent's Information page of our school website.

A second form was sent to parents who responded to the first form on 23rd February, to re-confirm their consent.

On receipt of this Consent Form, the Support Services Team will produce an NHS Track and Trace Card in advance of the Lateral Flow Test.

As I am sure you can appreciate, from a procedural perspective, receiving a Consent Form on the day of a child's Lateral Flow Test does not allow enough time for this administration process to be completed in time.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank our amazing Lateral Flow Testing team of volunteers who have already given up hours of their time, and will continue to do so next week, to help administer the Lateral Flow Tests.
