University Essentials

There are many things Year 13 students need to do to prepare for University. This section highlights some of the important elements you need to think about during the transition from Headlands to University.

- Apply for accommodation early Most accommodation sites work closely
 with the university so once you firm/insure your offer, you can apply for
 whichever accommodation you wish to live in. Budgeting is very
 important at this stage so if you are struggling to work out what price
 range is appropriate for you then please speak to Mr Cooke.
- Look at bursaries or grants These can financially support your studies at university. If you have a form of disability or come from specific backgrounds you may be eligible for these. Each university is different so do your research.
- Apply for student finance Student finance is a key aspect of university life. This covers your tuition fees, and your living costs based on your household income. You can apply for student finance through the government website.
- Open a student bank account This is a great way to budget for University, with most accounts giving special offers and incentives, such as free rail cards and resource-subscriptions. However, be careful when looking at these as you need to consider the different overdraft limits which will most benefit your living. All of these are 0% interest while studying.
