All students will be required to do one of the following options.

## Face-to-face work placement

Consider your career ideas and contact local businesses that relate to your aspirations. Ask the employer to complete the self-canvass form and return this to Mrs Dixon by Friday 28 May please. You will need to speak to the employer to arrange a suitable placement week during July-October and check this date with Miss Mulligan or myself. The Education 2 Work (E2W) team will then contact the employer to do the relevant health and safety and insurance checks. You will receive a copy of the Risk Assessment and your parents will need to complete the consent form.

## **REED virtual work placement**

If you have not got a face-to-face placement organised, then you will need to complete the REED virtual work placement programme. You will be given your log in details and further information about this in June.

## Benefits of work experience

- It will enhance employability by helping you work on a whole range of employment skills, from learning about and adapting to workplace culture to time management and teamwork.
- It'll help you identify your own skills and perhaps even highlight the areas that you might want to work on.
