COVID-19 May Holiday procedures

- School should only be contacted about positive cases where symptoms developed within 48 hours of the student being in school.

Instead we have set up a designated COVID-19 email address: **Covid19@headlandsschool.co.uk** which will be checked daily at 10am between Saturday, 29th May 2021 and Monday, 31st May.

Please only email us at this address if:

1: Your child developed symptoms within 48 hours of them being in school
AND

2: They have tested positive for COVID-19 via a PCR test

Any other queries sent to this email address will not be responded too. Only matters that meet the above criteria will be answered.

Should you have any other matters you wish to contact the school about during the May break please continue to email **admin@headlandsschool.co.uk** noting this account will not be looked at until our return on Monday, 7th June.

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
