uring the week, the Senior Team and I have met individually with students on a 1-2-1 basis to discuss their Progress Reports. As a secondary school this is an incredibly unique opportunity and allows every student the chance to talk to a Senior member of staff about their school experiences, what is going well and what support they feel they may need to improve. These meetings require dedicated

time and it takes us approximately 7 school days to meet with a year group. As such the Progress Řeports will be emailed out on Thursday 16 December 2021. As a parent of a secondary school child myself, I know sometimes we have questions or gueries about the contents of the report and what they may or may not mean. I would encourage you to discuss your child's Progress Report with them during the holidays taking every opportunity to celebrate with them the Progress they are all making. Then, should you have unanswered queries, please contact the school in the New Year. Please direct gueries that are in respect of subjects to the subject teacher - not Year Leader. If you have any questions about attendance, the number of comments on the report or the number of stamps, then please contact your child's Year Leader. Remember, Progress Reports are a "moment in time" and are merely a snapshot of our child's progress in school. Lots can change between now and their next Progress Report and our first priority remains your child's happiness. I am delighted to report that overwhelmingly the students report, in all year

groups, that they "love" learning at Headlands School. Super news for the Friday before Christmas!

his is the last Headlines of 2021. So may I take this opportunity to thank everyone for their support over the last year and my team and I will look forward to working with you all again in 2022.


