PE Kit

All students are required to bring a PE kit for their core lessons twice a week. The only exception to this is if a student is physically unable to change due to a medical condition. When a student is ill or is suffering from an injury please provide a note in their planner explaining the problem. Although students will still be expected to change into their PE kit, their teacher will assign them a non-participation role such as a coach, scorer, or official all of which are assessed as part of our Head, Heart, Hands assessment framework.

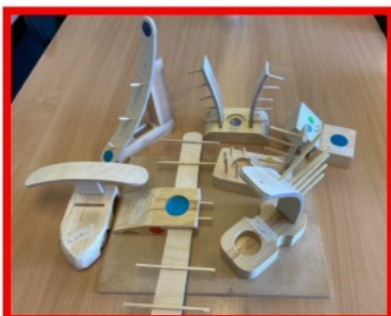
The most basic PE Kit is: Plain red t-shirt, Plain black shorts or bottoms, Red football socks, white or black tennis socks

In addition to this during winter months, we highly recommend that students have a plain black or red jumper, fleece or lightweight showerproof jacket (not their school coat), or a base layer skin, a plain beanie hat, and gloves.

If there is a genuine reason for students not having their PE kit with them (e.g. not able to wash from the previous week or it can not be located) please write a note in their Student Planner explaining this.

When students do not bring in an item of PE kit and do not have a note in their Student Planner, they will receive a Comment and be offered a clean spare kit. If a student refuses to wear this kit they will be given a second Comment, removed from the lesson, and receive an after school detention.

- Signposting to local organisations

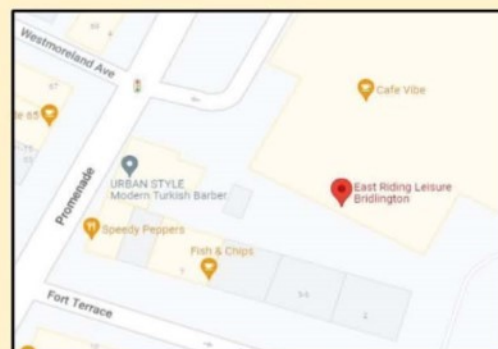
