Our students responded incredibly well to the content of the Assembly and have continued to ask appropriate, probing questions about the ongoing humanitarian crisis affecting millions of people. Please continue to support our campaign in partnership with the Bridlington Echo and CYP to help Ukrainians fleeing the war, by collecting toiletries and vital goods.

Students can bring items into school and leave them with their Tutors or they can take them to the drop-off point at the CYP on Gypsy Road in Bridlington. Thank you so much in advance.

Drop off times at the CYP are 9am to 7pm Daily.

Ideally, goods should be in a shoe box or similar packaging.

Goods should be sealed and unopened.

Please hand over to a member of staff. Do not leave outside if the centre is shut.

The main entrance is at the rear of the building with easy car parking.
