

Student Behaviour in the Classroom

Verbal Warnings	1 st Comment
Issued when: disrupting learning. For example, continuing to talk when the teacher has requested students stop and listen and / or complete a task in silence.	Issued when: behaviour that was requested to stop (verbal warning) continues and / or where a behaviour does not meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning standards.
2 nd Comment	3 rd Comment
Issued when: 1 st Comment has been issued and behaviour(s) continue. Student will be moved within the classroom; teacher will talk to student at the end of the lesson <u>AND</u> teacher will call home. A detention will also be issued for the next day.	Issued when: 2 nd Comment has been issued but the behaviour(s) continue. Student is therefore moved to another classroom.
Emergency Cover (E-Cov) (4th Comment)	Pride. Aspire. Respect.
✓ If a student refuses to move to another classroom; OR	Pride: wear your correct uniform to all lessons & tutor. Wrong shoes = social times with Year Leader.
 ✓ When moved to another classroom the student continues to not meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations; OR 	Aspire: positive attitude towards your learning in all lessons & tutor. Arrive on time to school and lessons.
✓ For a one off, significant incident in the classroom that is beyond the control of the teacher;	Respect: self-regulate behaviour(s) during social times and conduct yourselves in a polite and courteous manner at all times.
The teacher will use Edulink to contact E-Cov and the student will be placed into Return to Learn for the remainder of the lesson.	Return to Learn (R2L) 6+ Comments = 1-day R2L Any additional Comments above 6 within a week = additional day(s) in R2L Refusal to follow staff instruction i.e. hand over Student Planner = 1 day R2L
