Message from Mrs Stamford

Thank you to all parents and carers who attended our virtual Year 8 Parents' Evening last night. The night was a great success and I hope you all enjoyed finding out about the progress your child is making at Headlands School.

Over the next few weeks, students will be undertaking some assessments in their lessons ready for our staff to prepare the first progress reports of the year. Your child's report will be discussed personally with a member of the Senior Leadership Team and then you will receive the reports home in the last week of term.

KS3 Reports will include a description which relates to how much progress a child is making in comparison to the 'age related expectation' for that particular year group, together with an Attitude to Learning Grade.

KS4 & KS5 reports will include a predicted grade together with an Attitude to Learning Grade.

These reports will also detail your child's attendance, any marks, rewards and sanctions from September to December. This information is also available on the Edulink App/Website at any time.

On Monday 21 November we will be showing the England v Iran World Cup Game. The match will be shown in the Barn and the lower school canteen for those students who are on lunch and want to watch the game. Students in timetabled lessons at this time will have the match shown in the background.
