## Message from Mrs Stamford

This week some of our students have taken part in Bikeability Level 3 this week. The skills gained in the qualifications enable students to learn to ride on busy roads and navigate junctions, multi lanes and traffic lights safely.

I would like to remind parents dropping off and picking up at the front gate, not to stop on the yellow zigzags, not to use the bottom of the drive as a turning circle and to only travel up the drive in an emergency. I would also like to remind parents that the speed limit is 5mph.

We have 1000 children walking in and out of School and this week I have been concerned for the safety of some of our students around the bottom of the driveway in particular. We will be addressing road safety with the students through assemblies.

This week all students have attended an OddBalls assembly which has raised awareness for cancer and mental health. The OddBalls Foundation was founded in 2015, to raise awareness of Testicular Cancer. Ambassadors visit schools to remove any stigma and embarrassment about checking for cancer. Testicular Cancer is around 95% curable so early diagnosis and regular
