A source is evidence from the time period eg. From 1558. An interpretation is talking about the time period but it has been made since that time period.

An inference is when you look at a source or interpretation and you make a judgement on what it is telling you eg 'This tells me that..'

A supported inference is when you make a judgement eg. 'This tells me that...' but you also explain 'I know this because....' And then you quote or describe to support your inference.

SOC = Second order concept. Eg. As a result..... This was important because..... This was significant because.....
