Verbal Warnings	Comments		
Issued when: student behaviours are not meeting Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations.	Issued when: student behaviour that was requested to stop (verbal warning) continues <i>and / or</i> where student behaviour does not meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations.		
Year Leader After-School Detention Issued when: For example: ➤ students receive 2 Comments in a lesson ➤ students refuse to follow staff instructions 1st time ➤ students are using abusive language towards another student	Senior Leader After-School Detention Issued when: For example: > students fail to attend Year Leader After-School Detention > students are late to 2 or more morning sessions within a week. > students behave in a way that does not meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations (but the behaviour does not warrant a Fixed Term Suspension) > Students are late to class on more than 4 occasions A student's failure to attend a Senior Leader After-School Detention will lead to a greater sanction.		
Suspensions from class or school RTL Issued when: students receive 6, 8 or 10 comments in a week. Failure to attend SLT detention, any other behaviour that is deemed serious enough to warrant a suspension from class. Refusal to hand a planner to staff on request will result in RTL Truancy from lesson will result in RTL. Internal Exclusion Issued when: Behaviour in RTL does not meet expectations, or when periods in RTL have no impact on behaviour. Or for a serious breach of the school Positive Discipline policy. Fixed Term Suspensions Issued when: students do not meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations. This may be consistently, or as a one off serious breach. This is determined by the Headteacher.	Permanent Exclusions Issued when: For example: > students are persistently verbally abusive to students and /or staff > students are racist > students sexually harass other students > students persistently fail to meet Headlands School's Behaviour for Learning expectations > students carry out a "one off" incident where the behaviours of a student are judged to be "beyond the control of the school." This may include a student physically assaulting another student (in / out school)
