THE EDUCATIONAL

EXPERIENCE

The educational experience in the Sixth Form is different to that of the rest of the school, lessons are delivered in a fresh manner, and there is a greater emphasis on what you can do for yourself. However every member of staff here at Headlands are always available to offer you any advice and support you call for.

Class sizes in the Sixth Form are on the whole much smaller than you have experienced, most of our classes have around 10 students, meaning that your teachers are more able to offer you the guidance you need.



WHAT WE OFFER

In accordance with similar schools and colleges, most of our students opt to study 3 A Levels or Level 3 equivalents.

All courses at Headlands are linear and as such this means students do not sit AS levels at the end of Year 12 as these do not contribute to their final A Level grade, however we do have rigorous internal examinations that inform progress in preparation for applying for post 18 destinations.

As members of Team Headlands Sixth Form, our students are also expected to take part in our enrichment programme that will further develop them personally and set them apart from other university applicants. This programme consists of accredited volunteering opportunities, work experience and the potential to study other qualifications outside of the main curriculum.





HEADLANDS SIXTH FORM SCHOLAR

We are incredibly fortunate here at Headlands Sixth Form to have been gifted a yearly scholarship of £30,000 for two of our students, over a fiveyear period beginning in 2017.

The "Headlands Scholars" are selected by the Headteacher, Director of Sixth Form, and a representative from the Governing Body. As this scholarship is to fund the cost of University tuition, potential scholars must have secured places at Higher Education establishments prior to applying for the scholarship.

This is a unique and life changing opportunity for two of our exceptional Sixth Form students.






THE HEALTH ACADEMY
