Mrs Bone's Newsflash

This week as part of the Governor's Behaviour Committee, we discussed Governor observations of students in the canteen and toilets over the course of a week. Governors were really impressed by the orderly way in which our students queued for food and confirmed the longest wait time was 10 minutes.

Around the toilet areas again observations confirmed there was either no queue at all or students were waiting no longer than 2/3

minutes to go to the toilet.

It was acknowledged that students who came to queue last in the canteen - having spent time outside the canteen before hand - left themselves 10 minutes to eat their lunches. As a result we have agreed to increase lunchtime by 5 minutes, by reducing the length of Tutor time by the same amount.

Thank you to Governors for volunteering your time to come and observe the above

operational matters. Moving forward Governors will revisit the school to measure and report back on these operational changes.
