STEM



Five Year 11 students visited East Riding College to take part in a Bricklaying taster course on Thursday 29th February. The session was led by Mr D Marshall (Course tutor) which involved a walk round, discussion about the construction industry and the facilities at the ER College site. Mr Marshall highlighted the sustainability of the

course, as all of the walls etc that are built, are taken down after assessment, the bricks cleaned up and the mortar reused. They use a lime based mortar and have a machine to recycle the used mortar for use over and over again.

Students were then given a demonstration on how to set out a course of bricks working to basic building standards. Mr Marshall highlighted the need for a sound understanding of maths as brick dimensions, mortar depths and standard house sizes were discussed. This was followed by each student having their own work area and constructing a 5 course brick wall. ER College students completing the Level 1/2 Bricklaying course were on hand to give advice and support. Nearly all of our students had never had a go at bricklaying and this made the results of their brick walls very impressive. Several students are now considering Bricklaying as a future career option.
