Overview:

Year 10 students will continue to study both English Langauge and English Literature preparing them for their GCSEs and gaining skills that they can use in the world beyond Headlands.




With a focus on developing skills gained in Year 9, you will focus on the reading section from Language Paper 1. Encountering a wide range of fictional texts, you will explore and analyse the writers' use of language and the intentions and messages behind these choices.

Term 1:

Literature

Language

You will begin Year 10 by exploring the world of Scrooge and Christmas Spirits when studying 'A Christmas Carol'. You will develop the knowledge gained in Year 9, ensuring an understanding of plot, character and contextual factors.

Term 3:

Language

You continue to develop your Speaking and Listening presentation, ensuring that your opinion is heard clearly. Following on, you will focus on mainly non-fiction texts and examine how writers use language to demonstrate their thoughts and perspectives.

Literature

You will follow this by exploring Shakespeare's Macbeth - learning about the genre of tragedy, themes of witchcraft, regicide and tyranny. You will learn to apply critical theory and contextual knowledge to this famous play.

Term 2:

<u>Language</u>

Allowing you to speak about a topic you feel passionately about, you will begin preparing for your Speaking and Listening presentation. This is followed by an exploration into creative and non -fiction writing; thereby allowing you to be imaginative and opinionated.

Literature

You will be diving into the social world of the play 'An Inspector Calls'. You will examine the social context and the dramatic writing of this modern play.
