Students in the ARC study APEX (Achieving Personal Excellence) from Years 7 to 11. Mr Belcher coordinates this programme where students are able to explore a range of topics which are important to their development and understanding of their place in society.

Each topic allows us to celebrate their achievement through the AQA Unit Award. APEX complements our PSHE provision and is flexible to allow us to change units we follow to meet the needs of a particular cohort. Alongside this we have Enrichment sessions in the ARC where students are able to make a choice around activities they are involved in. These activities aim to help students develop their social skills, life skills and require them to cooperate with their peers.
