Term 2: Component 2

On the first of February your exam board (AQA) will release the Externally Set Assignment. The marks for this must be returned to AQA by the 31st May.

You will have a choice of 8 starting points. The ESA consists of a preparatory period where you will investigate, explore and record ideas. Similarly to your Personal Investigation there are 4 assessment objectives to meet, summarised below.

- AO1: Develop ideas through investigation showing critical understanding
- AO2: Explore resources, media and processes to refine ideas
- AO3: Record ideas, observations and insights, reflecting critically
- AO4: Present a personal and meaningful response realising intentions

Component 1

Personal Investigation–Continues from Year 12

Personal investigation chosen by you and discussed and agreed with Art and Design teacher.

You will consider various approaches by different artists from a variety of genres and historical contexts and develop a personal response.

You will be expected to **initially research at least 6 influential artists** in your chosen topic before specialising.

You are expected to fully engage in the project so the resulting work is innovative and personal.

Work will be presented as a coherent project including an **essay** (1,000—3,000 words) documenting your artistic journey and showing **analytical**, **critical and evaluative skills**.

You should also produce a final outcome/s that is reflective of at least 15 hours of work.

Component 1 is worth **60%** of your overall grade.

Terms 2 & 3 – Component 2 Externally Set Assignment

<u>Preparatory period</u> – Each question paper will consist of a choice of eight questions to be used as starting points. You are required to select one. Preparatory work should be presented in any suitable format, such as mounted sheets, design sheets, sketchbooks, workbooks, journals, models and maquettes.

<u>Supervised time</u> – 15 hours - Following the preparatory period, you must complete 15 hours of unaided, supervised time. The first 3 hours of the supervised time must be consecutive. In the 15 hours students must **produce a finished outcome or a series of related finished outcomes,** informed by their preparatory work.

Component 2 is worth **40%** of your overall grade.
