On Wednesday this week Hull University came in to spend the day with a group of our Year 8 students. The students were split into teams to compete in the Cupcake Challenge.

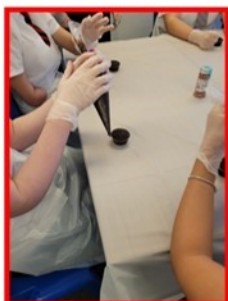
