On Tuesday students attended an inspirational event which aimed to inspire women and girls to consider a potential future career in the emergency services. There were speakers from the Lifeboat Service, Lifeguards, HM Coastguards, Police, Ambulance Service, the Army, RAF and Humberside Fire and Rescue. They shared stories on how they have overcome challenges, how outdated attitudes and bias have been barriers, and most inspirationally, how they have overcome these and forged forwards to become experts in their field.
