Message from Mrs Stamford

This morning Year 11 have been given their new timetables which begin on Tuesday 6 May in preparation for their GCSE exams. These timetables have been carefully considered to enable your child to receive the best preparation for their exams. Each exam has a revision session prior to the exam which must be attended. After half term, there are some "home study" sessions built in where students are able to remain at home and complete their own personal revision. However, before half term, the schedule is very tight with lots of exams in succession and the revision has been designed to

support your child with this.

Year 11 students will be expected to attend all exams in full school uniform.


Football

The game took place in high wind on a heavily sloping pitch and after weathering an early storm within which they defended well Headlands took control of the game and eventually took one of their chances to go into half time 1-0 ahead.
