
Headlands Book Fair!

HETA - Engineering Apprenticeship Applications now open - For Year 11/13 students

To apply for a HETA apprenticeship, you need to meet the following entry criteria:

GCSE Grade 5 or above in English

GCSE Grade 5 or above in Maths

GCSE Grade 5 or above in any Science

As part of your application, you will need to input your predicted GCSE grades. If you have already obtained your GCSE results, simply input your actual results as part of the application. After submitting an online application form, you will complete an engineering assessment to evaluate your core Maths and English skills as well as engineering reasoning and problem solving.
