It is always a difficult period in my life to recall but is a moment in time which has shaped my entire life. If by sharing my loss means young people are able to recognise the importance of wearing a seatbelt now and in the future, it is absolutely worth sharing. Wearing a seatbelt would quite simply have saved my friend's life.

Please encourage your child(ren) to discuss all aspects of road safety over the coming weeks - and this is always a topic that needs revisiting both at home and in school as we know teenagers are in the higher risk category for being involved unfortunately in road traffic incidents.
