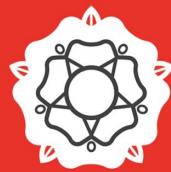
R O Y A L N A V Y V I S I T S

CAREERS IN STEM



On Wednesday afternoon, a selection of Year 9 students attended the Construction Apprenticeships drama workshop. The theatre group performed a range of scenarios to highlight knowledge about apprenticeships, job roles across the industry and interview technique. Pupils actively took part in discussions based on each drama scenario and then analysed an interview scenario. Groups of students worked together to support a fictional character "Lewis" develop his interview technique, with one member of each group sitting alongside "Lewis" answering interview questions.
